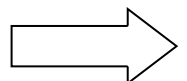

In addition to publicizing the Cedarkirk summer camp program in your bulletin and newsletter, we offer the following suggestions and encourage you to adapt them to your own situation.

STEPS TO GET YOUR CAMPERS TO CAMP

- ◆ Give Bulletin Blips (see the enclosed pages) to the person in charge of the Sunday Bulletin.
- ◆ Give Newsletter articles (see the enclosed page) to the editor of your church newsletter.
- ◆ Pick a week (or weeks) for children and youth at your church to attend camp at the same time.
- ◆ Have the church set a goal of how many campers you want to send to camp this summer.
- ◆ Invite a Cedarkirk staff person to speak at a Sunday morning worship service, Sunday School hour, or Wednesday night program.



- ◆ Choose a Sunday to promote as "Camp Sign-Up Sunday." If you would like materials or assistance in planning your "Sign-Up Sunday", contact Cedarkirk and we'd be happy to assist in any way we can.
- ◆ Offer and promote scholarship assistance to children and youth in your congregation and surrounding neighborhoods.
- ◆ Personally encourage children and youth to attend, particularly those that you feel could benefit from this experience.
- ◆ Make an office computer available for parents to register online after a church service. All you need is an internet connection and a web browser.
- ◆ Help publicize the Open House, Saturday, May 1st, with the included flyer and by putting it on your church's calendar of events.

HELPFUL HINTS FOR CAMP DISPLAYS

- ◆ Create displays using pictures of former campers and any special mementos they might have of their experiences. Past Cedarkirk campers could wear their camp t-shirts to church.
- ◆ Enlist past campers in the creation of promotional posters, collages, banners, etc.
- ◆ Have past campers write short articles to describe what a week of camp means to them. Display pictures or art work done by these campers.
- ◆ Make a "thermometer" to show the progress being made toward your goal of camper sign-ups.

HELPFUL HINTS FOR YOUR "CAMP SIGN-UP DAY"

- ◆ Have a "Camp Sign-Up Day" on Sunday, or another day if more desirable, to kickoff or give a boost to the registration of campers. You may want to emphasize particular weeks during the summer when groups of campers from your church would attend at the same time.
- ◆ Use the Bulletin Insert with the Cedarkirk summer schedule (included in your bag). If you are unable to locate it, please visit www.cedarkirk.org (publicity materials are located under the "Summer Camp" tab) or contact the camp office at camps@cedarkirk.org or 813-685-4224 to receive your copy-ready master.
- ◆ Select one or two enthusiastic campers from past summers to share their experiences at camp with your congregation.
- ◆ Set up a tent in front of the church with a sign announcing "Camp Sign-up Sunday."
- ◆ Have a designated camp sign-up table.
- ◆ Invite a Cedarkirk staff person to visit that day to answer any questions related to the summer program.
